

What Is Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)?

ASB can be many different activities including:

- Drug Dealing
- Criminal Damage, vandalism or arson
- Intimidation or Harassment
- Noise Nuisance
- Street Drinking
- Rowdy and nuisance behaviour
- Dog Fouling
- Fly-tipping or fly-posting

What Will Happen if I Report ASB?

The investigating agency may ask you to keep a diary of any incidents of ASB that affect you for up to 28 days. This information helps us to see if there are any patterns to the ASB, and can assist in identifying the perpetrator(s). The Neighbourhood Officers may also visit you depending on the level of the ASB. Any information you give us will be treated confidentially and we will only share the information you provide us with the organisations that can help us with our investigation.



Who do I Report ASB to and How?
